Uncrowded beaches with blindingly white sand, water in just about every shade of blue and natural surroundings of palm trees and lush vegetation; Mother Nature didn't hold back with the Seychelles. In this archipelago of 115 islands, most of which are uninhabited, it's the main island of Mahé which is usually the first stop for visitors. With a forested interior that cascades down lush mountainsides to over 60 dreamy beaches fringing the island, it's almost too gorgeous for words.

Praslin, the second largest island, is a laid-back escape of stunning beaches and lush tropical forests. Highlights include Anse Lazio, often named one of the world's most beautiful beaches, and the UNESCO-listed Vallée de Mai, home to the iconic Coco de Mer. On La Digue, life moves at a gentler pace, with bicycles the main way to explore and endless picture-perfect beaches to enjoy. It's also home to the rare paradise flycatcher, best spotted in the Veuve Nature Reserve. Silhouette Island, the third largest, is an untouched gem of rugged cliffs, dense forests and pristine beaches, all fringed by a protected coral reef. Meanwhile, Denis Private Island offers secluded luxury, with tranquil nature trails and dazzling beaches perfect for soaking up the sun.

If you simply can't choose which jaw-droppingly beautiful island to visit, or are looking to enhance your Seychelles experience, we highly recommend island hopping. Each island has its own attractions, characteristics and ambience, not to mention the exquisite stretches of sands and by island hopping, you'll get a real feel for the Seychellois way of life.
