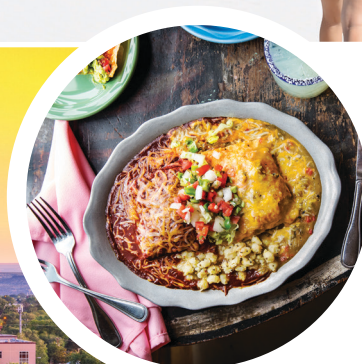

Trails of New Mexico & Texas

◦ Day 1 - Fly to Austin

On arrival, make your own way to your hotel. Settle in and get acquainted with the 'Live Music Capital of the World'.

◦ Day 2 - Austin

A day at leisure to explore this eclectic city. Wander through South Congress, soaking up the vibrant atmosphere and street life, enjoy a canoe trip along the river, and cool off with a dip in Barton Springs Pool. Sample Austin's food scene - famous for its Texan brisket - before heading to Congress Avenue Bridge to witness the spectacular sight of the city's bats at sunset.

◦ Day 3 - Sonora

Collect your motorhome and begin your adventure, making your way to Sonora, a small Hill Country town known for its scenic landscapes. You may wish to break the journey in charming Fredericksburg.

◦ Day 4 - Marathon

Depart Sonora along the scenic I-90 towards Marathon. Stop at the Pecos River High Bridge Lookout or Seminole Canyon State Park & Historic Site for striking desert views.

◦ Day 5 - Big Bend National Park

Arrive in Big Bend National Park, where vast desert landscapes reveal a raw, untamed beauty.

◦ Day 6 - Big Bend National Park

Discover the park through scenic drives, hiking and world-class stargazing.

◦ Day 7 - Marfa

Drive to Marfa, stopping at Terlingua, a quirky ghost town known for its desert charm and historic ruins.

◦ Day 8 - Carlsbad

Travel to Carlsbad via the striking landscapes of Guadalupe Mountains National Park. Nestled in the Chihuahuan Desert, the town offers a relaxed atmosphere with tree-lined streets and historic sites. Nearby, descend into vast limestone chambers at Carlsbad Caverns National Park, where towering stalactites and cathedral-sized rooms, including the famed Big Room, create an otherworldly underground landscape.

◦ Day 9 - Alamogordo (White Sands National Park)

Located in the high desert at the base of the Sacramento Mountains, Alamogordo is the gateway to one of the world's great natural wonders - White Sands National Park, where shimmering gypsum dunes stretch across 275 square miles of desert.



◦ Day 10 - Alamogordo (White Sands National Park)

A day to explore the beauty of White Sands National Park. Arrive early for sunrise over the gypsum dunes and explore the shifting landscape. Return in the evening to see the dunes glow at sunset.

◦ Day 11 - Albuquerque

Journey via Truth or Consequences, known for its natural hot springs, or detour to Bosque del Apache Wildlife Refuge, famed for birdlife and serene wetlands. This evening, sample Southwest flavours in one of Old Town Albuquerque's atmospheric restaurants.

◦ Day 12 - Albuquerque

Take the Sandia Peak Tramway, one of North America's longest, for sweeping views over the Rio Grande Valley. You may also wish to visit the Indian Pueblo Cultural Centre for insight into Native American heritage. Afterwards, sample local wines or craft beers.

◦ Day 13 - Santa Fe

En route to Santa Fe, take a detour to Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument to explore cone-shaped formations and scenic trails. Santa Fe, set in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, offers over 400 restaurants, 250 galleries, and 19 museums. Spend the afternoon exploring Santa Fe Plaza, visiting San Miguel and Loretto Chapels, or Canyon Road's galleries.

◦ Day 14 - Santa Fe

Delve deeper into the region's heritage with a visit to Bandelier National Monument, once inhabited by ancient Puebloan people. Back in Santa Fe, continue your cultural journey at the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum before dining at one of the many acclaimed restaurants.

◦ Day 15 - Roswell

Travel to Roswell, perhaps stopping at Pecos National Historical Park or via Santa Rosa to visit the Blue Hole. Explore the Roswell Museum and International UFO Museum and enjoy its fun alien-themed streets that celebrate the city's famous extraterrestrial connections.

◦ Day 16 - Lubbock

Drive to Lubbock, consider a stop in Brownfield for lunch. Known for its musical heritage, visit the Buddy Holly Centre, dedicated to preserving the legacy of the rock 'n' roll pioneer.

◦ Day 17 - Abilene

Continue your journey towards Abilene, taking a scenic detour via Caprock Canyons State Park. Abilene is a welcoming Texas town known for its rich Western heritage and vibrant arts scene.

◦ Day 18 - Austin

Leave early for Austin to return your motorhome, then make your own way to the airport for your onward journey.
